EHS over Threshold Notification Section 302 Reporting Module

The Section 302 Reporting module notifies compliance authorities when there is a change in the amount of extremely hazardous chemicals onsite. This information is critical for emergency planners who need to maintain accurate Emergency Response Plans. Through the 302 Reporting feature, facilities can submit the 302 notifications online throughout the entire year. Compliance authorities can run reports on which facilities have made notifications. Planners and First Responders can also access the reports to understand which chemicals have changed and by how much.

New 302 Report
Submission Listing

Section 302 of Title III of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 (SARA Title III) requires that owners or operators of facilities notify the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) and their Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) if they have on site an EHS in an amount equal to or greater than its threshold planning quantity (TPQ).

The Section 311 Reporting feature provides businesses with a way to submit the material safety data sheets (MSDS), or a MSDS list, for the hazardous chemicals present on-site in excess of the threshold level to the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC), Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs), and local fire department. This is essentially a one-time submittal unless your chemical or product changes. Businesses can pick the chemical from a look up list or from an already submitted report. If the chemical is selected from an already submitted report, the MSDS will be transferred. Otherwise, the user can add the MSDS attachment. This information is made available for rapid retrieval for LEPC, Planners, and Responders.

These two features together streamline the 302/311 reporting requirements for your agency.
